# COUNCIL APPROVES CHILD AND YOUTH PLAN

April 12, 2005 - Vancouver City Council today approved a work plan submitted by Child and Youth Advocate Sheila Davidson. The plan covers the next three years and will focus on housing for youth, the impact of service cuts by the provincial Ministry of Children and Family Development and the Ministry of Human Resources, interactions between police and youth, and challenges facing aboriginal children and youth.

"Aboriginal children make up the fastest growing urban population in Canada," said Davidson. "While the Aboriginal community should be applauded for a number of fine initiatives and individuals who are making a difference in their community, ultimately it is the creation of greater social inclusion which will make a significant difference in their lives."

In July, 2003, Mayor and Council approved the re-instatement of the Child and Youth Advocate for the City of Vancouver. Getting a Child and Youth Advocate back in Vancouver was a key part of COPE's 2002 campaign platform. The NPA axed the Child and Youth Advocate position in 1999 when they had a monopoly on Council and before COPE's Tim Louis and Fred Bass were elected in the fall of 1999 and put COPE back into City Hall.

# LIBERALS SNUB COPE SCHOOL TRUSTEES

Vancouver area provincial Liberal candidates declined to meet with COPE school trustees and the VSB's Advocacy Committee - comprised of students, parents, teachers, and trustees. The Advocacy Committee scheduled the April 08 meeting to brief provincial election candidates on education concerns. Nine NDP and four Green Party candidates attended.

"The BC Liberals declined to meet with us, which is not surprising," said COPE trustee Noel Herron. "They seem to be running away from public discussion on education and health issues." An April 11 all-candidates meeting at False Creek Elementary School was cancelled when Vancouver-Fairview Liberal candidate Virginia Greene withdrew at the last minute.

# COPE PARK BOARD ASKS FOR YOUR INPUT ON \$90 MILLION PLAN

The Vancouver Park Board approved a preliminary capital spending plan that calls for almost \$90 million worth of parks and recreation upgrades over the next three years. The plan also includes 2010 Winter Olympic related projects.

"We will be scheduling at least three public meetings in May to get public feedback and input on the proposed plan," said COPE Park Commissioner Anita Romaniuk. "Details of those meetings will be posted on the Park Board website as soon as they are final."

Once approved by the Park Board, the plan goes to Vancouver City Council before it is put to a referendum at this November's civic elections as part of Vancouver's capital plan.
