(Vancouver, Canada) ? Building on an a tremendously successful Mother's Day March and Rally in 2004, Grassroots Women will honor Mother's Day with two events in the heart of the Vancouver's working- class community.

**This May 8, 2005, at 2pm, working- class mothers, their children, childcare and domestic workers, and supporters will gather at Woodland Park (Woodland and Adanac) and march to Grandview Park on Commercial Drive to support the call ?Universal Childcare is a Women's Right.? The March and Rally will include speakers from various community organizations, performers, and children's activities.**

On May 28, 2005, Grassroots Women will release a comprehensive and timely report entitled ?Between a Rock and a Hard Place: Examining the Impact of Childcare Policy on Marginalized Women.? The report is the culmination of a yearlong Participatory Action Research project involving over 70 mothers and childcare workers. The report documents the myriad of ways in which working class women's development and equality is stalled by childcare policy in Canada. It is a testament to the daily struggles of working class mothers and childcare workers as well as a tribute to both their individual and collective resistance.

?Despite decades of promises, Canada still has no universal, national childcare policy,? explains Rachel Rosen, a childcare workers and member of Grassroots Women. ?So the Live-in Caregiver Program ? where domestic workers are little more than modern-day slaves ? is the defacto national program. This highly exploitative program does not serve the needs of any working class women, including the domestic workers themselves. This is why it is essential that we take to the streets to reclaim Mother's Day!?

Grassroots Women has been campaigning for universal childcare since 1999. As part of this campaign, Grassroots Women has presented working class women's demands for universal childcare to federal Minister of Social Development Ken Dryden and has mobilized over 5000 people to send postcards to the federal government calling for the implementation of a universal childcare program.

The Komagata Maru's Return To Vancouver  
Filmmaker To Attend Opening Night Screening  
Vancouver, B.C. - A powerful retelling of one of the most shameful episodes in Canadian history will launch the 2005 DOXA Documentary Film & Video Festival.

Filmmaker Ali Kazimi's groundbreaking new film, Continuous Journey tells the story of the Komagata Maru, a ship that carried 376 passengers - men, women, and children - from British India to Vancouver's harbour in 1914. As subjects of the Crown, they believed they had the legal right to settle in one of the Empire's territories. Instead, the passengers lived like prisoners for two months, threatened by famine and disease as the ship was refused permission to land.

An essential addition to Canadian history, Continuous Journey is presented in an original way that resonates powerfully with contemporary events. Involving eight years of research, the film is solidly documented, packed with archival material, and offers an insightful portrait of Vancouver at the turn of the 20th century. Audiences and critics across the country have been moved by this telling of a little-known piece of Canadian history.

The DOXA screening of Continuous Journey is made possible by the generous support of Library and Archives Canada. Mr. Ian E. Wilson, Librarian and Archivist of Canada and Member of the Order of Canada, will join the filmmaker and other distinguished guests for this local premiere.

DOXA is an annual documentary film festival dedicated to bringing thought-provoking and compelling films to local audiences. This year's festival will run from May 24 - 29, with schedule and ticket information to be announced soon.

The School will be a fun and dynamic opportunity for marginalized people to learn and share concrete skills to become life-long organizers for social justice. Last year's 10 School graduates all expressed that they learnt innumerable skills which they continue to use as they organize in their communities today.

As you may be aware, the Bus Riders Union is a grassroots project to build a working class multi-racial women-led organization fighting for the rights of transit-dependent communities in the Lower Mainland. We develop campaigns that address the concrete struggles of transit-dependent people and link them to a movement for short term and structural change. In a supportive, challenging and creative environment, School participants will learn and engage with both the theory and the practice of organizing for social justice. We will discuss the different forces of oppression and exploitation ? from patriarchy to systemic racism to the political-economic system that we live in ? and engage with the history of people's resistance both locally and globally. We will talk about the nuts and bolts of organizing ? strategies and tactics based concretely on the example of the BRU and other inspiring case studies. Participants will learn to build consciousness and mobilize their communities, strategize and carry out grassroots campaigns, and train for a lifetime of organizing.

**The School will run for two sessions a week (a total of 6 hours/week) from May 29 to August 1 2005. Participants will be expected to attend an orientation session on May 15 to meet facilitators and other participants, get information about the School and receive their package of readings and other materials.**

Both new activists and experienced organizers are encouraged to apply to participate in the School. We prioritize and welcome women and people from communities of colour and Aboriginal communities. Some honoraria and childcare subsidies may be available. Space is limited so apply soon!
