### 3. Local women's group to rally on International Women's Day - Mar 8th

A local women's group will hold a rally to mark International Women's Day this

Saturday, March 8, 2008

from 4-5 p.m.

at Oppenheimer Park

(Cordova St. and Jackson St.)

in the Downtown Eastside of Vancouver.

Under the theme, "Resist Imperialism! Solidarity in the struggle for women's liberation!" the group hopes to gather many progressive women and men in the annual event.

"We will rally to celebrate the struggles of working class women in Canada against imperialism and show genuine solidarity with the national liberation struggles and struggles for women's liberation in Third World countries," says Merry Edwards of Grassroots Women.

"Working class women in Canada face daily exploitation in the workplace and increasing vulnerability because of the flexibilization of labour," says Edwards. "They also struggle to find affordable, quality childcare, housing, healthcare and public transit often facing sexism and racism. Migrant and immigrant women, refugee women and indigenous women are often the most exploited and oppressed in our society working at the lowest-paying jobs. Migrant and refugee women and their families also live under the constant and overbearing fear of the threat of deportation because of draconian immigration rules. Despite these challenges, we take inspiration from women's historical struggles against exploitation and oppression and therefore celebrate International Women's Day," says Edwards.

"We also take inspiration from women struggling against direct and covert attacks from imperialism," says Edwards. "We will hear stories of women struggling for national liberation and women's liberation in different parts of the world," she adds.

The annual rally will be followed by a community dinner at 5:30 p.m. and a forum at 6:30 p.m. at the Kalayaan Centre, 451 Powell St. in Vancouver.

#### 4. Citywide Housing Coalition: Street-Corner "stands" For Housing - Saturdays

##### STREET-CORNER "STANDS" FOR HOUSING

Continue this Saturday and next

Neighbourhood housing activists will again stand on Vancouver street corners, Saturday March 8 for one hour, 1-2pm, with banners and wearing vivid blue scarves. They'll be calling attention to federal and provincial failures to build permanent social housing, and the City of Vancouver's proposed abandonment of deals with Concord Pacific for affordable housing in downtown condo towers.

STANDers will also be paying respects to the hundreds of dead and dying homeless men, women, and children- victims of legislated poverty and government neglect in BC and Canada. In Vancouver they populate our streets and lanes, huddle in parks and encampments, burn to death in doorways, are crushed in back alley garbage bins.

Ten "STAND for Housing-Homes for All!" sites have been confirmed for this, the third of four weekly Stands:

- Main St & King Edward (Ned Jacobs, Mary Ann Code, and CALM)
- Arbutus & King Edward (Homeless Nation and Random Acts Of Kindness -RAOK)

- Heather & 6th Ave (Rider Coeey and False Creek neighbours)
- Commercial & 1st Avenue (Anna Truong, Dave Diewert & Streams of Justice)
- Cordova & Gore (Anne Kennedy and St James Social Gospel Coordinating Group)
- Oak & W 49th Ave (Leslie Kemp and Unitarian Church Social Justice Cttee)
- Commercial & Broadway (Lauren Gill, Homeless Nation and RAOK)
- Burrard & Nelson (Bobbie Phillips and the St Andrew's-Wesley Homelessness & Mental Health Action Group)
- [Christ Church Cathedral, Georgia & Burrard, will resume next week.]

Some STANDs for Housing will pause over the Easter Break, Friday to Monday March 21-24, then continue, calling for substantial funding to be dedicated by federal, provincial, and

municipal politicians to building new, permanent, low- and welfare-rate housing. Using the surplus billions in the prosperous economies of Canada and BC to build the full spectrum of housing for all citizens is the primary mechanism by which homelessness must be defeated. The public and media are invited to join us at any of the above locations. The idea of the STAND is based on the moving example of the Mothers of the Plaza de Mayo, whose children were "disappeared" by the military, 1976 to 1983. They stood every week in a city square wearing white scarves until the generals capitulated. The scarves became an international "brand" for protests against unjust and inhumane governments.

Rally Against Private Power Development

Not Green, Not Smart, Not Needed!

On March 11, TAKE BACK THE POWER!

British Columbians must stand up for our public utility and our wilderness areas. These private power projects threaten both the integrity of BC Hydro as well as wildlife and fish habitat. Take a stand on Tuesday March 11 at the BC Power Summit and let the private power companies and the provincial government know that BC wants clean, public, and responsible energy - for generations.

In 2002 the BC Government announced a new Energy Plan that forbade BC Hydro from investing in new sources of hydroelectricity. The provincial government turned to private power providers, creating a gold rush race, with private interests snapping up water licenses on wild streams and rivers throughout BC. Over 60 water licenses have been granted to private hydro projects in the last 7 years, and there are 433 more applications pending.

These power developments are NOT small hydro - many are massive megaprojects with serious environmental impacts, including transmission lines through provincial parks and old growth forests, as well as irreparable damage to wildlife and fish habitat.

The government calls this green power. It isn't. Let's send the BC government a strong message and stop the giveaway of our resources.
